Theft

CPD Case# 14-6700-OF

CONCORD, NH - The Concord Police Department is asking the public for their assistance in identifying the suspect in a recent theft.

It is alleged that on February 11, 2014 at approximately 4:00 PM a woman was shopping in Target, which is located at 80 D'Amante Drive in Concord. The woman had stopped in at Target with her young children after purchasing merchandise from Best Buy (located next door to Target). The merchandise in question included a Wi-Fi "Hot Spot" device and a cell phone car charger. The woman was carrying the merchandise in a blue Best Buy shopping bag.

The woman reported that she had placed the shopping bag in a cart while in Target. At some point the woman exchanged carts at the request of her children and accidentally left behind the Best Buy bag containing the merchandise.



Later while shopping, she noticed that she did not have the bag anymore and went to look for it with no success. The woman notified Target officials who later examined store surveillance video.

The video revealed that another female, described as being white with short brown hair, in her late forties, wearing a white New England Patriots sweatshirt entered the store at approximately 4:05 PM. The suspect female was in the store for approximately ten minutes before she approached the victim's unattended shopping cart and removed the blue Best Buy shopping bag. The female then left the store and got in a tan colored two door vehicle and left the parking lot.
